A few tips:

1. All of the locations are in Wauwatosa or barely over the border in Milwaukee.
2. Not all locations are open 24 hours. Check hours of operation online to make sure you don't waste a trip.
3. If you haven't been to one of these retail locations before, take a look around and consider buying something to support our local businesses.
4. Google is your friend!

1. A jolly old Little Free Library in Inglewood NA contains a "book" that Hope wrote about in a college English class. Take one of the items inside.
2. A high-pressure job Hope had as an undergrad involved bags and tubes. Pick up one of those components from the staff at Tosa's cygnet-themed "chemist."
3. For her doctorate, Hope proved that hackberry trees produce a fruit with a pit made of opal. Find a hackberry tree in Tosa (there are lots!) and take a picture with it. (Hint: The city has a Master Tree Plan.)
4. This Village shop is where Tosans go to feel clean and fragrant. Stop in and ask the staff for something that features plants that Hope would love.
5. Future scientists are trained at this institution that "towers" above others. Stop at the Welcome Center and have someone on your team take a selfie with the prop they provide.
6. This downtown building used to be home to awls, rasps and gimlets. Now you'll find pistils, anthers and filaments. Stop in and ask for a giveaway.
7. Hope's Chessie was a dock-jumping champion. Where might she practice agility skills like that in Tosa? Go to this popular hangout for Tosa canines and pick up one of their brochures.
8. One of everyone's favorite plants is *theobroma cacao*. Go to the quintessential Tosa source and answer this question: What amount is on the antique cash register behind the counter?
9. You know what Bill did with the hair he cut off. Clean out your brush or save some hair from your next trim and find a similar structure with a hiding place for your hair. Take a selfie when you hide it!
10. You'll find science and technology businesses, not baby chicks, in this nurturing environment. Find it and count the number of arches above the main entrance. Number: _____

- 14.** Hope now lives in Norway, where this sport is enjoyed by all ages. Their motto is "Brooms are meant for stacking, NOT for chores." Take a selfie with the plaque on the outside of the building. If it's open, stop in to say hi!
- 15.** Kids who want to be a scientist like Hope can experiment on a toy microscope. Find one at this lively, happy store and write down the maximum magnification it provides. _____
- 16.** When Hope and Bill went digging in Ireland, they might have heard a hornpipe or two -- just like you might hear in this new café, by golly. Stop in and make note of their first house rule: _____
