1. You must be a resident of Wauwatosa or attend a Wauwatosa public or private school to be eligible to compete in the writing contest.
2. First and second place cash prizes will be awarded by age level:
Grades 3-5: \$30/\$20 Middle school: \$50/\$30 High school: \$75/\$50 Adult: \$100/\$60
3. Your essay must be your own creation and not a retelling of the story.
4. There is no minimum length, but all essays must be no longer than 1,000 words.
5. Winners will be published on the Tosa's All-City Read website.
